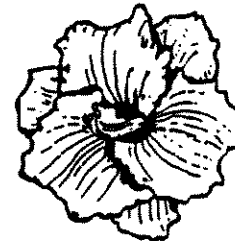

REMINDER: CVIDS ANNUAL FALL PLANT SALE & POTLUCK

Don't forget that our annual plant sale and potluck will be held Saturday, Aug. 26, from 10 AM to 2 PM at the gazebo in Riverside Gardens in Monticello. This is our main fund-raising event. We hope all members will be able to contribute plants, help with digging and labeling, and/or help out at the sale itself. Please label all plants with name, color, and price, at a minimum. Choice items might also include hybridizer, year of introduction, and list price. **Please bring your labeled iris, daylilies, and companion plants to the park by 9 AM so we can have everything nicely laid out on the tables by 10 AM.** We will have our potluck and distribute club auction plants after the initial rush of public sales subsidies; in previous years this has happened about 1:30. There will also be a few club plants available which were not bid on in the auction; these will be priced at the "minimum suggested bid" in the auction, which is approximately half of the average price in the current edition of Eureka.

All plant contributions are welcome. However, we always sell out of all tall bearded irises and hostas, as well as most daylilies in colors other than yellow, so **TBs, hostas, and pink, purple, red, and white daylilies are especially welcome.**

Please price your plants; the members working at the sale may not be familiar with the varieties and may not know what they are worth. Iris and daylilies will be sold as bare-root plants and should be clearly marked with name and color. Older named varieties will be priced at \$3-\$5; "unknown yellow daylily" or "red seedling", etc., for \$2-\$3. Newer varieties should be marked with hybridizer and year, if known, and priced appropriately. Companion plants should be potted, if possible, and labeled.

We hope all our members will be able to help with the sale in some way. If you have plants to contribute but can't bring them to the sale yourself, please contact the Stolls (319-946-3471; walnuthl@netins.net) to arrange for someone to pick them up. If possible, try to bring some pictures of the daylilies or other plants you are contributing. People always ask us, "What does this one look like?" It's really helpful to have some pictures so we can show them, not just tell them. Posters with colored pictures of daylilies and iris would be especially helpful. Just having the color pictures there at a time when most people's gardens are in the late-summer doldrums can generate interest and increased sales. Bringing along blooms is also good for sales -- and for everyone's pleasure.

Help Wanted! The Stolls and others would also appreciate volunteers to help with digging and labeling of plants anytime the week before the sale (especially on Thursday and Friday, Aug. 24-25). They have a great many plants they would be happy to contribute to the sale; however, the plants need to be dug, divided, and labeled in the days just before the sale so they will be nice and fresh for Saturday, and Lynn and Barry can only do part of this project themselves in a few days.

Don't forget: we need lots of publicity to make the sale a success! In addition to our ads in local area newspapers and shoppers, etc., word-of-mouth advertising is very important. Do your part: tell your friends and neighbors. Let's make this our most successful sale ever!

2000 CVIDS MAIL AUCTION

For the last eight years, CVIDS has been using a portion of the club funds to buy some choice daylilies (and occasionally other perennials) for the club. These plants are distributed among active members to grow for two years. At the end of the two years, the members keep a plant equal to the size they had received, and all increases are given to the club for auction or sale. This highly successful program has been self-perpetuating, allowing club members to grow some choice new cultivars and providing income for additional club plant purchases and other club activities. The program has been virtually self-supporting, and has allowed members to grow many fine new daylilies, such as those on the attached list, without paying premium prices. Based on its initial success and members' enthusiasm, this program has been greatly expanded in the last several years.

The plants listed below for our 2000 silent auction have been grown since 1998 by CVIDS members. The suggested minimum bid for daylilies is approximately half the average double-fan price listed in the 2000 edition of Eureka. As in previous years, the procedure for the mail-in auction is as follows:

1. Please make your bids uneven amounts (e.g., \$19.42) to reduce the likelihood of ties.
2. Send the auction form to Lynn Stoll, 999 310th St., Atalissa, IA 52720, postmarked no later than August 21. Do not send payment at this time.
3. Lynn will notify winners, who will then be asked to send checks for their winning bids to the Treasurer.
4. Plants will be delivered at the Aug. 26 sale in Monticello. For those with winning bids who are not able to attend the sale, plants will be shipped for a small additional fee.
5. Bids postmarked after August 21 will be accepted only if no other bids have been received for the plants.
6. In case of ties, the earliest postmark will win. All plants will be distributed; any not bid on in the auction will be put in the public sale in Monticello.
