

Report On Plant Sale

The Cedar Valley Iris and Daylily Society, which was formed this spring in eastern Iowa, has now grown to 40 members and has applied to become an affiliate society of the American Iris Society. The group held its first plant sale on August 25 at Riverside Gardens in Monticello, Iowa, and succeeded in raising \$900.

The proceeds will be used initially for preparations for the Region 21 1991 Spring Tour to be hosted by our club and headquartered at the University of Iowa Memorial Union in Iowa City from May 24-26 (Memorial Day Weekend).

After the tour, the money will be used to buy some of the choice new iris and daylily cultivars for members to grow in their gardens for the club, with the increases eventually to be used for further club auctions and sales.

For this first sale, we are especially grateful for the many plants donated by Region 21 and by Roger Nelson, formerly of Wayne, Nebraska, who now resides in Brooks, Oregon.
