Book order from AHS *The Open Form Daylily: Spiders, Unusual Forms, and Other "Exotics", Author: Oliver Billingslea* This publication is first and foremost a botanical book, treating two recognized classes of daylilies in a format typical of books published by the American Botanical Society, and in the final chapter offers a brief look at those open form daylilies which hybridizers sometimes call "flamboyants" or "exotics," although these types at present are not recognized as constituting a class of daylilies in themselves. The book features the work of numerous hybridizers along with stunning photography submitted by members of the American Hemerocallis Society. Presented in a full-color 8½" x 11" format to enhance the quality of the photography, the text and layout of *The Open Form Daylily: Spiders, Unusual Forms, and Other "Exotics"* are by its author Oliver Billingslea, AHS Chair of Special Projects.
