CVIDS Garden Tour

This year's tour will be on Saturday, July 17. We'll be starting our tour at the garden of Clay & Kathleen Dawson at 9:00. A map to their garden is attached.

The second stop on the tour is the garden of Bob & Barb Papenhausen. Leave Dawson's and return to Hwy 61. Turn right and go south 6.6 miles to I-80. Take exit 123A to Chicago. Continue on I-80 2.1 miles to exit 298 I-74. Continue on I-74 for 5.6 miles to exit 1 to River Drive. 26/4 4 Turn right on River Drive and go 3.3 miles. Turn right on 7th Street and go 1 mile to 28th Avenue and turn right and go .03 miles to the end of the street and turn right on 4th Street Court to 2614 - 4th St. Court. It's the brick house on the right near the end of the court. If lost, call 309-755-7398 or 309-737-0830.

> Next we'll head to the Appelquist gardens. Leave Papenhausen's and go 2 blocks to 28th Avenue. Turn left on 28th, go 3/10th mile to 7th Street. Turn right on 7th and go 2 miles to John Deere Road. Go right on John Deere Road 2.4 miles to Exit 74-6 (Galesburg). Exit right onto 74. Go 1.2 miles to 27th Street. Right on 27th to first stop light. Left at stoplight (sign will say Milan Airport Road). Drive west 2 miles to 1st stoplight, turn left on Milan Beltway. Go 2.7 miles to 1st stoplight (NOT stop sign) Route 67 four-lane, Turn left and go 1.2 miles to Coyne Center Road. Left on Coyne Center Road 1.6 miles to Appelquist's.

The last stop in the Quad Cities is the Williams' garden. Leave Appelquists and return to Route 67. Turn right (North) on 9206 3557 67. Drive 1.2 miles and turn left at miles to 1st stoplight (NOT stop sign) 35th

Ave. West and the stopling of Ave. West and turn left and immediately turn right in driveway and go to the 2nd house at the end of the lane.

Gary & Holly Williams have generously offered to feed everyone lunch, so plan on eating at this stop.

We'll finish up the day at Stoll's Walnut Hill gardens. Leaving the Williams home, go left out of the drive to the stoplight. Turn left at stoplight on 92nd Ave. West to pick up 280 to Des Moines in approximately 2.5 miles. Get on I-80 West when the opportunity arises and head west to the Atalissa Exit #265. Go south 1/4 mile on Atalissa Rd. (gravel) to 310th St. Turn right (west) on 310th St. and go exactly 1 mile until you reach Johnson Road on the left. (Do not turn at Kelly Rd. where you will see a "dead end" sign. Continue straight 1/2 miles west at this point.) At Johnson Road, turn right into our private lane. You will see a large brown mailbox and a blue street number sign (999). We can accommodate no more than 4 cars at the house. Other visitors can park in the field in front of the house or on the county road.

Mislabeled Plant Alert

Last year (May 2003) at the club plant distribution at Jean's house, Cathy Moore purchased Siloam Vaughn's Classic. It had its first blooms this summer and is not the correct plant. It bloomed a peachy pink with a ruffled edge and small yellow throat and green heart. It measures 24/26" x 5-5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". It is not the yellow self that is Siloam Vaughn's Classic.

If you need labels, the club has some of them for club use. Give Gerald a call about acquiring some at (319)372-4178. If possible, pictures of the plants you are donating are very helpful. Bringing blooms along is also very helpful for sales and enjoyable for other members.

We hope all members will be able to contribute plants, help each other with digging and labeling, and/or help out at the sale itself. We want to have a good variety of clean, fresh, healthy plants for sale! Don't forget to tell your friends and neighbors about this sale. Let's make this our most successful fall sale ever!
