CVIDS SWAP & SEEK

Would you like to swap daylilies with other club members? Are you looking for some specific cultivars but have had no luck? Then do we have some options for you! You are cordially invited to participate in this summer's CVIDS Swap & Seek. Here's how it works:

Plant Swap:

- Each member may offer <u>up to</u> three cultivars (as double-fans) to swap. (Note: CVIDS club plants eligible for return to auction may not be traded).
- 2) Collect the following information for each plant from the AHS Cultivar Search Site at www.daylilies.org: Name, hybridizer, year of introduction, scape height, bloom size, bloom season, ploidy (Dip or Tet), foliage type (EV, SEV, DOR), bud count, branching, and flower color. If you don't have internet access, please ask a CVIDS buddy to help you. *Example:* Love Is Enough, Douglas-C., 2011, 27", 5.5", M, Tet, SEV, 18 X 3, Butter yellow w/ ruffled edge
- By July 15th, send this information to Keith Riewerts by e-mail or US mail. His contact information is: P.O. Box 67, 310 Eastwood Drive, Long Grove, IA 52756, rkrkrkr@netins.net
- 4) About August 1st, you will receive a spreadsheet summarizing all plants being offered for swap by club members. This list will also be posted on the CVIDS website but will not include telephone numbers or addresses.
- 5) Call other members to make trades. You'll find phone numbers and addresses in the membership roster as distributed via e-mail or US mail.
- To transfer plants, bring them to our August 22nd meeting at Monticello, visit other members' gardens, or use US Mail, UPS or FedEx, etc.



Seeking Plants:

So you want a piece of Lavender Blue Baby or Heavenly Angel Ice? Well, we recommend that you first search the 2003-2014 Club Plant Distribution database on our website (http://www.cvids.org/clubplantsdatabase.html). If you find that a club member has one of these cultivars, call them and negotiate a deal. If your search is unsuccessful, try this approach:

- 2) About August 1st, you will receive a spreadsheet summarizing all plants being sought by club members. This list will also be posted on the CVIDS website but will not include telephone numbers or addresses.
- 3) If you see some of your available cultivars on the list, call the member and negotiate a deal.
- 4) To transfer plants, bring them to our August 22nd meeting at Monticello, visit members' gardens, or use US mail, UPS or FedEx, etc.
