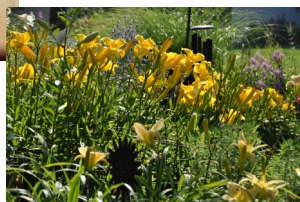

CONGRATULATIONS, SHELLY !!!

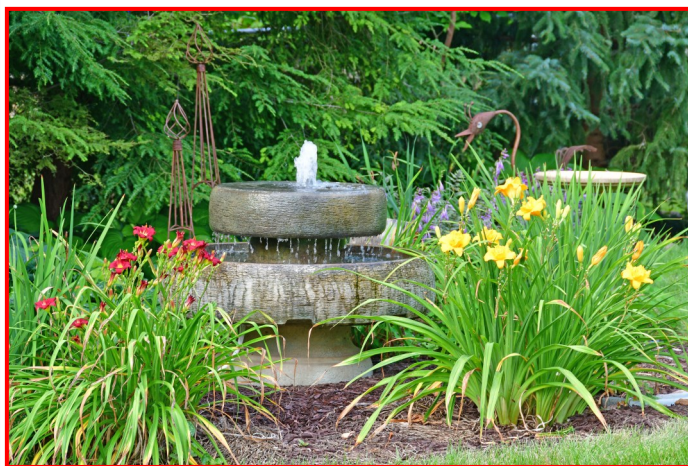
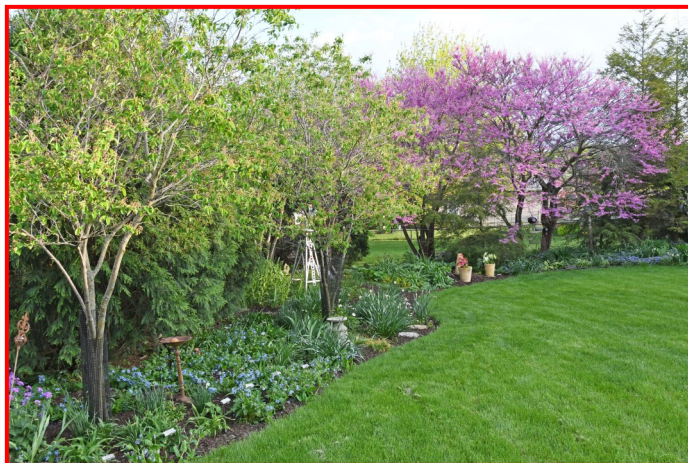

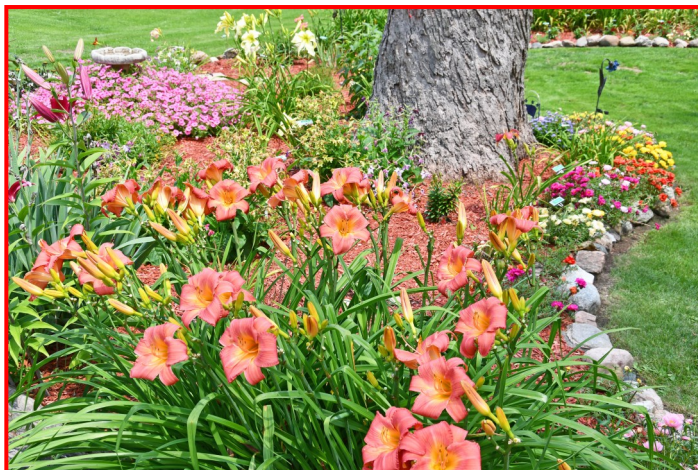

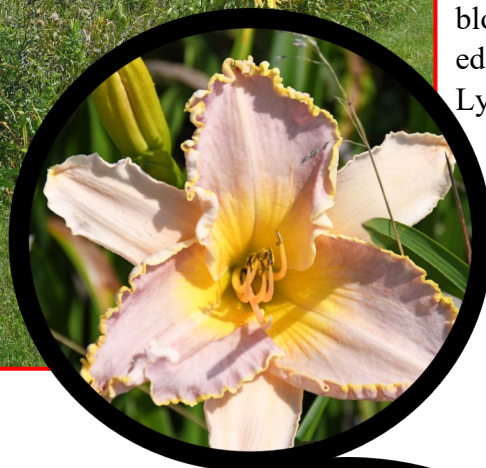
