I will begin promptly at 7 PM with some instructions and introductions. I do ask that you MUTE your microphones during the program. Here are some reminders and Zoom etiquette for attendees: Mute your microphone to keep background noise to a minimum when you are not speaking. ^a Be mindful of background noise. Find a quiet spot away from other household activities and nonparticipants. ^a Position your camera properly: be sure it is in a stable position and focused at eye level. Or, disable your video. ^a Limit distractions. Peony Zoom Meeting February 18, 2021

THE GARDENER'S GUIDE TO PEONIES NOTES BY NANCY RASH

It was difficult to manage Zoom, take notes and watch all the photos of beautiful peonies in the presentation by Harvey Buchite. I'll send some high-

lights from February 18 and I encourage you to look at his website.

The peony world has award winning peonies that include the American Peony Society Gold Medal (GM) and Award of Landscape Merit (ALM) peonies. In response to the question about selecting peonies that will not droop, it was recommended to select a peony from one of the GM or ALM lists.

I especially liked his directions for a 20% increase in the bloom size. Who wouldn't want extra large booms! Take off the side buds

when they are pea size. (some of mine never open anyway). And to avoid bringing in ants with your bouquet, pick the peonies early in the morning before the ants are out.

Harvey recommended looking for a recipe on line for a home-made spray to prevent powdery mildew. The secret is to apply very early in the season. That means, before the mildew becomes a problem. The formula is 2.5 tablespoons of Neem oil (or Sunspray) and 1 tablespoon of baking soda in 1 gallon of water.

There was a question about fertilization of peonies. Use bulb food with low nitrogen and high potassium. The best ratio for a sandy soil would be 8-16-32. For gardeners in the rich fertile soils of Iowa the lower ratio of bulb food, 3-5-3 would work well. One of the key points is that over fertilizing with a high nitrogen liquid fertilizer used for annuals would likely result in more disease problems.
