CLUB PLANT DISTRIBUTION

MAY 15 & 16, 2020

There are 56 CVIDS members that will be receiving club plants this year. The selection process for 2020 was created to make sure we are following the "Social Distancing" rules and still allow us to distribute the plants that were ordered from hybridizers last fall.

- 1. Using the same process that numbers have been drawn in the past at West Liberty, each member was given a number in advance and then the order of plant selection is determined by the randomly drawn numbers.
- 2. Barb Papenhausen will call members in this order to ask for the name of the club plant they would like for 2020. Be sure you have viewed and use the list posted on the website and face book to make your selection. I would recommend you have a list of 5-10 plants in priority order so you can easily identify your top choice(s) when called. Barb will start calling members on Friday, May 15 to ask for your priority list. You will make a selection so she can then call the next person. Hopefully we are all prepared and it goes quickly. Barb will also confirm the location where you will pick up your plant. No changes in the pick-up location can be made after you are called on May 15.
