# CVIDS Salad

(You Gotta Love This Salad)

I have modified (and renamed) this recipe from Charlie Abplanalp, an orchestra teacher and long-time friend from Central High School in Davenport. There are many variations, but you will soon find the way you like it best. RKR

#### Salad Base:

1 small head of cabbage, shredded, or 1 pkg. slaw cabbage from produce section 3 to 4 green onions

or chop 1/4 sweet onion (to taste)

1 ea. 3 oz. pkg. Ramen Pride Oriental flavored noodles crushed (use dry)

(You can experiment with other Ramen noodles flavor packets e.g. pork)

1/2 C. sunflower nuts (dry roasted if possible)

1/2 C. slivered or sliced, toasted almonds

Shredded carrots (optional) to add color

1/2 can chopped water chestnuts (optional) to add more crunch
