If you missed Jonathan Poulton's class several years ago on his search for a blue daylily, you can catch it this year at the Friday seminars. Phil Fass is gathering our regional hybridizers and will give them several opportunities to share their efforts.

And of course we need lots of good, named daylily cultivars for our boutique. Proceeds from everything sold in the boutique, plants and auction items, will come to CVIDS and help defray the regional expenses. Now is a good time to survey our gardens and see what daylilies we can share. Attendees at the regional meeting will be experienced daylily people so the quality of the plants should be quite a bit better than what we offer at the plant sales for the general public.
