BOARD RESPONDS TO CONCERNS ABOUT CLUB PLANT ELIGIBILITY

Members attending last month's meeting in Coralville expressed their concerns about the 2012 club plant eligibility requirements that were approved in April 2011 (for details, see April meeting minutes). After much discussion, the Board was requested to draw up new guidelines for consideration at the Fall Banquet. Accordingly, the document shown below will be discussed and voted upon at the banquet. If you have any concerns or questions about this proposal but are not attending the banquet, please contact Zora Ronan. While it is not part of the rules, another concern that the Board would like to address is communication and the timeliness of the information. It is working on a system to keep members informed on a regular basis of their attendance and other activities.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLUB PLANT DISTRIBUTION

A club plant is a reward for being an active member of the club. Each year, CVIDS will use a portion of its funds to buy some choice daylilies that will be distributed in the spring to eligible members to grow in their garden for two years. Members choose their plants in a lottery draw. Members are asked to help evaluate the characteristics and hardiness of their chosen cultivar in this area. It is expected that the member will treat their club plant with kindness yet let the plant experience the same growing conditions that make our Eastern Iowa area an unique one. In August of the second year, members will keep a plant equal to the original size (number of fans) that they received and return all fan increases to CVIDS for its Silent and Live Auctions that month. At that time, the largest double fan will be awarded to the highest bidder, and any additional increases will also be auctioned.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

To be eligible to receive a club plant for the current year, a member must have:

- ▶ paid membership dues for both the current and previous years (paid by April 1 of each year).
- ► contributed to the club's activities during the previous calendar year (January 1 through December 31) by undertaking any two of the following:
- (1) attended two club meetings (includes garden tour but not the banquet)
 - (2) served as a CVIDS Board member
 - (3) chaired or co-chaired a committee
 - (4) donated plants to a club sale
 - (5) assisted at the CVIDS plant sales or auctions
 - (6) presented a club program
 - (7) hosted a CVIDS garden tour
 - (8) written an article for the newsletter
 - (9) bid in the Silent Auction of returning club plants
- (10) performed any other activity that contributes to the success of the club.

SELECTION BY PROXY:

If a member with eligibility to receive a plant is unable to attend the Plant Distribution, he/she may assign a proxy to select a plant for them during the drawing. However, the member must inform the Treasurer of their designated proxy prior to the Plant Distribution. If no proxy is designated, no proxy will be chosen for them.

MINUTES FROM OCT.8 MEETING (CONT.)

Clay requested members interested in running for a position to contact him so he can add them to the list. The election will be held at the annual banquet.

A motion was made and approved to include the Newsletter Editor on the board (M/S Gary Oster/Clay Dawson).

A motion was made and approved to include the past President on the board (M/S Clay Dawson and Keith Riewerts).

2012 Regional Meeting: Zora gave a slide presentation promoting the regional meeting. Jackie Westhoff handed out a budget estimate and registration form. Jackie gave an overview of the events and passed out copies of the schedule and registration form.

Website: Jonathan Poulton would welcome any new photos that members would like to submit. He is especially interested in receiving photos of our May 2011 Plant Sale in North Liberty. You can pick up a Meet the Members booklet from Jonathan if you have not received one yet.

2102 Club Plants: Keith Riewerts has already been reviewing selections for the club plants. Keith passed a list for members to write down what their favorite plant is in their garden. A motion was approved to spend \$5,000 (same as last year) on club plants (M/S/C Keith Riewerts/Clay Dawson).

Club Plant Eligibility: Zora Ronan led the group discussion on revising the club plant eligibility that included a handout of the old (April 2009) and new (April 2011) eligibility for club plant distribution. The Board was requested to develop new guidelines for consideration at a later meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:35 pm.

REQUESTED RECIPE FROM AUGUST POTLUCK NATILLAS BLANCAS (WHITE CUSTARD)

21/4 cups fresh or canned milk that has been diluted

3/4 cups sugar

½ tsp. nutmeg

1 Tbsp. cinnamon

3 eggs, separated

3 Tbsp. corn starch

1 Tbsp. sugar

Pinch of salt

Dissolve sugar and corn starch in 1 cup of milk in a shaker jar. Pour mixture into a pan, add nutmeg, cinnamon and beaten egg yolks. Add rest of milk, cooking on medium heat, and boil until it thickens, stirring often. Beat egg whites until stiff, adding 1 tablespoon of sugar. Fold into hot custard mixture. Chill or serve warm.

Serving suggestion: Vanilla wafers, strawberries or raspberries, whipped cream.

PLANT DONATIONS NEEDED FOR REGIONAL

Many CVIDS members are not aware that our club is an official affiliate of the American Hemerocallis Society, and, through that parent organization, also of Region One. We are dependent on this parent organization for our tax-exempt status and our liability insurance coverage. In hosting the regional convention in 2012, it is our turn to take responsibility for raising the funds that the region depends on for two semiannual issues of the regional newsletter "The Pioneer", as well as underwriting required attendance by regional officers at national meetings. We are expected to NET at least \$6,000 from this auction in 2012. (The Marshalltown club netted \$6.817 in 2009, and the much smaller North Dakota club, after having been in existence only a few years, netted \$6,765 in 2010.) This issue is especially crucial because there will be no regional in 2013 since the 2013 national will be held in Minnesota, in lieu of a regional. Thus there will be no opportunity to make up any shortfall if we fail to raise the expected amount of money next year. For that reason, we should try our best to make extra funds for the region.

The club will be purchasing auction plants next spring from hybridizers and other growers who are known to be extremely generous to clubs, often sending 100% or more in bonus plants. (This budget item costs the club nothing in the long run; the club's investment in buying auction plants is taken off the top of the gross proceeds from the auction and returned to the club before the net income is sent to the region.) However, since we will need to repay the club first from the auction proceeds for these purchased plants, the profit designated for the region is only a percentage (often less than half) of the sale price.

The best source of pure profit for the auction is plants donated by the members, for which 100% of the sale price goes directly to the region. We hope that each CVIDS member will donate at least one plant with a value of \$50 or more to the regional auction. More inexpensive plants will be sold at the Boutique, which benefits our club. But for the auction, it is better to have one plant with a value of \$50 than five plants with \$10 values. This will ensure a lively auction running at a brisk pace, rather than one that seems to drag on forever.

We hope that all members will start to think now about what they might donate to the regional auction. Perhaps members might consider donating a fan or two from one of those multifan clumps we get in the spring plant distribution – or a division of a club plant they have received in the past that has grown particularly well for them. Members might also wish to donate one or more newer bonus plants received from their orders this spring which they don't wish to grow themselves.

REGION ONE HYBRIDIZERS WIN AHS AWARDS

It was a great day for Region One when the annual AHS awards were announced at the Board of Directors meeting on Oct. 14. Region One had its first ever Stout Medal winner! Gary Schaben's North Wind Dancer won this year's Stout Medal with 55 votes. (1st runner up was Persian Ruby with 45, and 2nd runner up was Holly Dancer with 39 -- not even close!) Congratulations to gary for this wonderful achievement. But that's not all – gary also won 3 HMs for Captain Jack, Hakuna Matata, and North Wind Curly Joe.

Another big winner was Karol Emmerich. Her Intelligent Design was 5th in the Award of Merit voting with 61 votes. And she also won 3 HMs for Entwined in the Vine, Storm Shelter, and Handwriting on the Wall. Entwined in the Vine was the highest vote getter of all the HMs this year with 122 votes, runner up Wild Wookie (98), and the rest trailing far behind.
