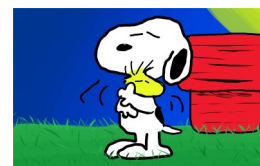

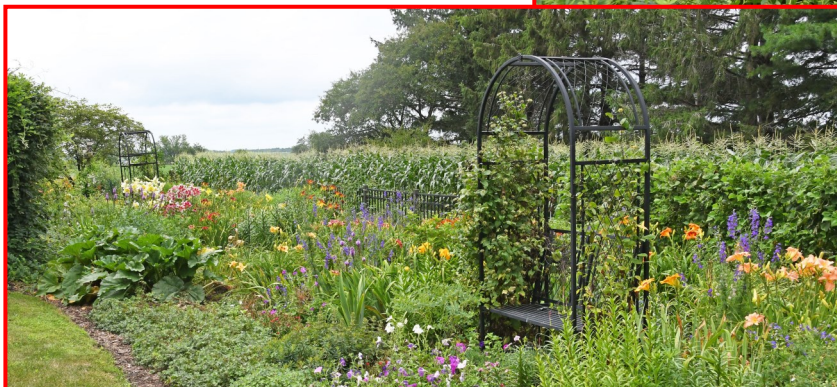
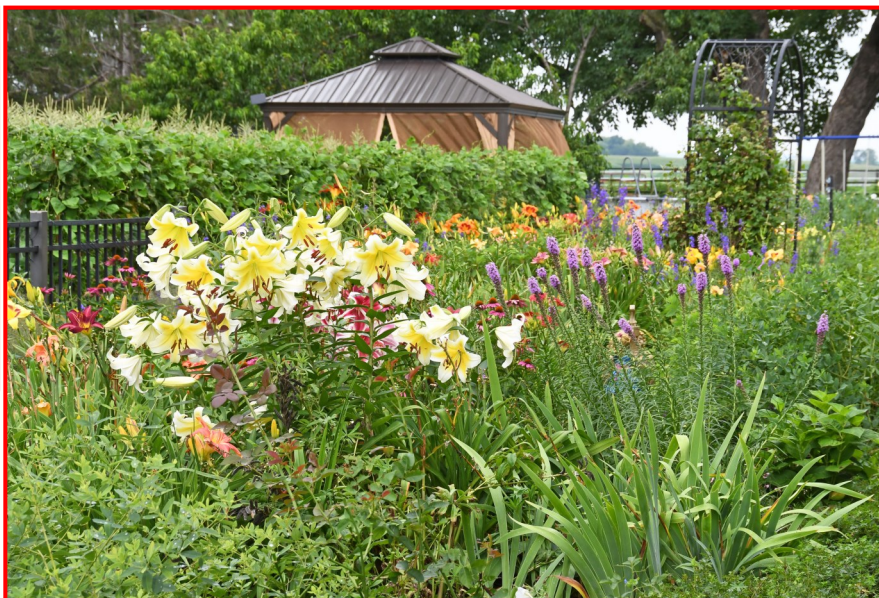
11:30 to 1 PM, Garden of Gina (Regina) Snyder

A water feature pond greets guests as they arrive

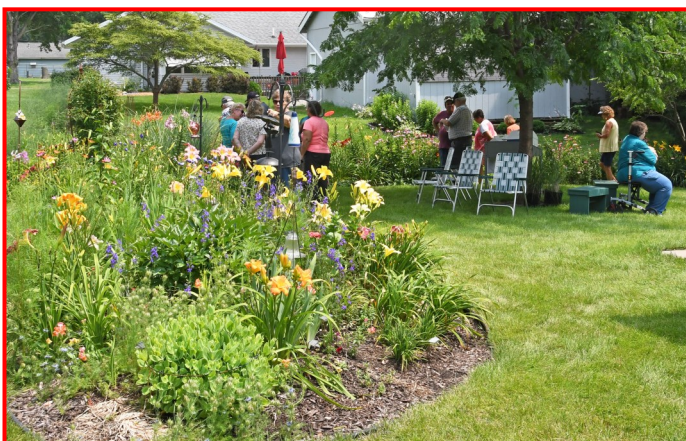


It seems the daylilies and flowers flow forever with peacefulness, grandeur, and a truly relaxing atmosphere

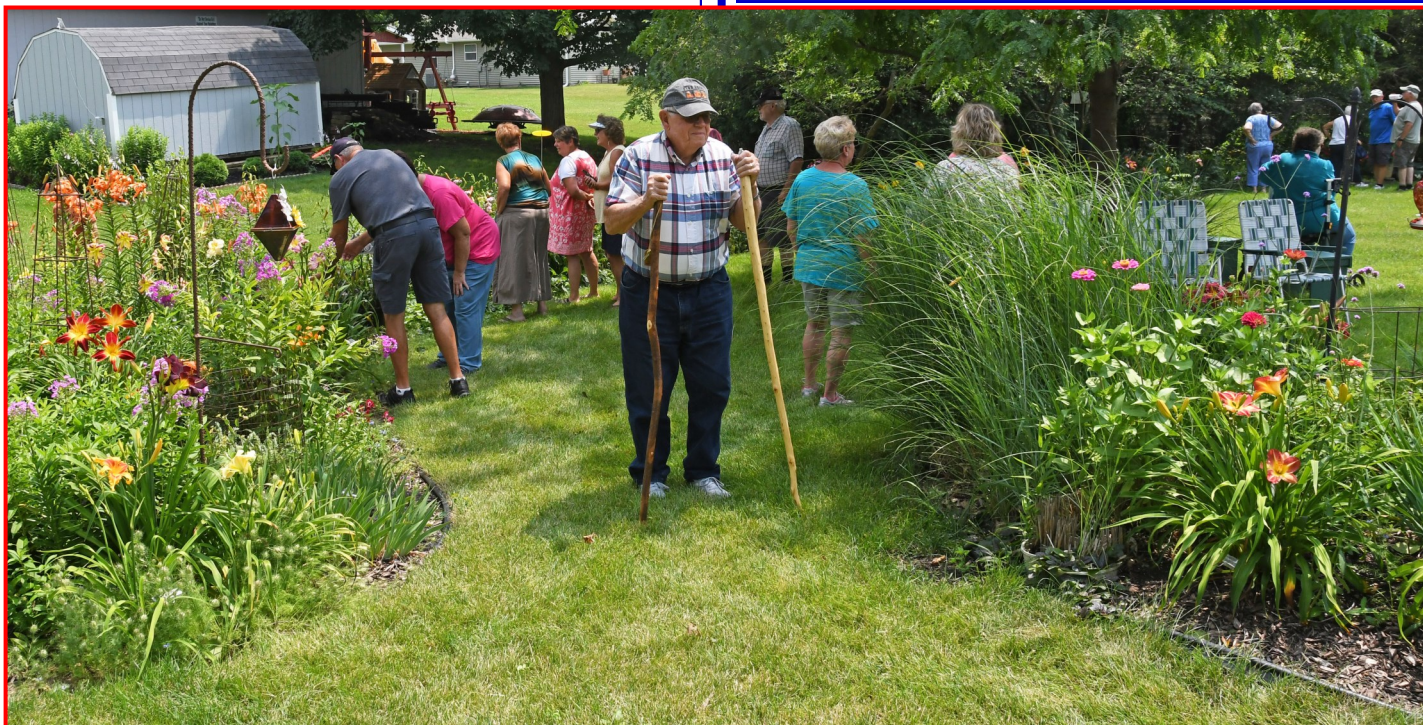
