The Fall Banquet will be held in the same location but the hotel is now the Holiday Inn and Kinnick Conference Center. Our speaker is Kirsten Hatfield. Kirsten Hatfield owns Dorsets N Daylilies along with her husband Jason. They are located in Zanesville Ohio on a 247-acre farm that they own. The farm is home to 600 daylilies, thousands of seedlings, 35 Angus cows, and 75 Dorset ewes and 50 White Dorper ewes. They also grow corn, soybeans, and hay.

Kirsten originally caught the daylily bug in the late 80's while working on Hemknoll Farms in Hope, NJ. She began hybridizing in 2012 and has 65 introductions with focus on double forms.

If you cannot attend the meal do come hear Kirsten speak at 1 PM. The presentation by Kirsten is at 1 PM. We will have a short business meeting with election of officers and Kirsten will have daylilies for a 50/50 auction.
