G. OPPORTUNITIES FOR VOLUNTEERING: You are cordially invited to volunteer to help run the club. As the Bylaws indicate, CVIDS activities are largely organized by the Board, which consists of elected officers and several committee chairs approved by the Board. The elected officers are the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and immediate Past President, all of whom serve two-year terms but cannot serve for more than two consecutive terms. Alternatively, you should consider serving as a committee chair (e.g. Newsletter Editor, Webmaster, Membership Chair, Club Plant Chair, Silent Auction Chair, Hospitality Chair, and Program Chair), for which terms are variable. Large numbers of volunteers are also required to assist at special events (i.e. plant sales, club plant distribution, silent and live auctions, fall banquet, and photo contest). For example, members can help at the May and August plant sales by setting up and taking down tables, organizing donated plants, answering customers' questions, bagging plants, assisting the treasurer with sales, setting up the potluck, and clean-up operations.
