### Club Plant Report

Club plants have been ordered as follows:

- 1) \$750 to Singing Oaks (will receive plants in the amount of \$1030)
- 2) \$500 to North Country (will receive \$750 worth of plants)
- 3) \$750 to Bells (will receive plants worth \$1100-\$1200).
- 4) \$500 to Jordans (will receive \$700 worth of plants)
- 5) \$500 to Carol Emmerich (will receive \$900-\$1000 worth of plants)

Our Singing Oaks order requires an additional \$25 shipping & handling due to the large number of plants. Sylvia asked if the club was willing to spend the extra. Dave Appelquest moved we pay the extra \$25. Kenneth Capps seconded. The motion passed.

A list of plants we know we will receive is attached so you can look them up in catalogs or on the Internet.

Club plant distribution will be at Sylvia's house on Saturday, May 21<sup>st</sup> at noon. Lunch will be provided by the club. Her address is 1722 W. 59<sup>th</sup> St., Davenport. If you're coming on I-80, take the Northwest Blvd./Highway 130 exit. Turn right

(south); follow Northwest Blvd (it curves around) to Division St. (the third stoplight). Take a right turn onto Division and go about 2 blocks. Make a right turn onto 59<sup>th</sup> Street. Sylvia's is the 3<sup>rd</sup> house, a gray ranch, on the right. There is extra parking at the school on Division Street. Her phone number is 563-386-9767.
